You are receiving this certification form because you are enrolled in the Minnesota Sustainable Forest Incentive Act (SFIA) program. You must complete and return this form to the Minnesota Department of Revenue by July 1, 2020, to receive your SFIA incentive payment for this year. See below for instructions.

Note: If you choose not to complete this form or receive a 2020 incentive payment, your land remains enrolled in SFIA and is subject to program restrictions.

Instructions

- 1. Read, and initial each statement in the Certification section to certify that you are meeting all SFIA requirements for your land enrolled in the program. (See below.)
- 2. Verify and/or correct the information listed in the Parcel Summary for each parcel of land you have enrolled in SFIA. (See page 4.)
- 3. Sign, date, and provide your phone number in the Signature section. (See page 2.)
- 4. Complete the Direct Deposit section if you want us to deposit your SFIA payment directly into your bank account. (See page 3.)
- 5. Complete the Woodland Activity Annual Report. (See last page of this form.)

Note: We mail or deposit SFIA payments on October 1. Your SFIA payment is taxable income. You must claim this amount on your income tax returns.

Where do I find the Account Number and Routing Number?

You can find these numbers at the bottom of a check or deposit slip, or contact your financial institution. The routing number must have 9 digits (numbers only). The account number may have up to 17 digits (letters and numbers). Leave out any hyphens, spaces, or symbols.

Note: If the routing or account number you provide is incorrect or not accepted by your bank, we will mail you a paper check for your SFIA payment amount.

Withdrawing from SFIA

Some landowners have asked us when they can withdraw land from SFIA program, how to withdraw, and how long the process takes. The answers depend on the length of your covenant.

- Your land must stay in SFIA for at least the length of your covenant (8, 20, or 50 years). After half of the covenant length has passed, you may ask to withdraw your land from the program.
- Under state law, there is a waiting period equal to half your covenant length before your land is removed from the program. So, after we receive your withdrawal application, your land will remain in SFIA for another 4, 10, or 25 years, depending on the length of your covenant.
- You will receive incentive payments during the waiting period as long as you continue to meet all the program requirements and return your certification to us by the deadline each year.

Note: Land enrolled in SFIA is bound by your covenant until you complete the withdrawal process – no matter the covenant length.

Example

- Paul Bunyan enrolls his land in the SFIA program in 2008 under an 8-year covenant.
- In 2020, Paul decides he wants to withdraw his land from SFIA. He sends a written withdrawal request to the Minnesota Department of Revenue.
- Paul's waiting period is 4 years (half the length of his 8-year covenant). His land remains in SFIA for 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024. The land is removed from the program effective January 1 2025
- Paul receives SFIA payments during the 4-year waiting period as long as he continues to meet all the program requirements and returns his certification by the deadline each year.

- If you sold land: You must indicate if you sold or transferred the entire parcel or a part of it. You and the buyer or grantee must determine which of you will receive the SFIA payment for that land and notify us in writing where to send the payment.
- If you acquired land: You must submit a new SFIA applications (Form CR TH1) to enroll any additional acreage or new land that you bought or received into the program. **Note:** You must submit a new application even if land was enrolled by the previous owner.

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Woodland Activity Annual Report – Return by July 1 to receive a 2020 SFIA payment

The Sustainable Forest Incentive Act (SFIA) requires you to implement your Woodland Stewardship Plan while your land is enrolled in the SFIA program. You must report annually on any woodland activities completed on your enrolled land. To meet the requirement, complete and return this report as instructed below.

Instructions

- 1. Complete this report by answering the questions below.
- 2. Mail the report with your SFIA Certification Form to the Minnesota Department of Revenue by July 1, 2020.

Note: You are not required to complete a woodland activity on your property every year. However, as previously required by SFIA, you must complete at least one activity every 10 years.

Plan implementation does not look the same for everyone and can vary based on your property goals, recommendations in your Woodland Stewardship Plan, and the conditions of your woodland.

The purpose of this report is to learn more about your woodland activities and to see if the SFIA law is successful in meeting one of its purposes: to encourage sustainable forest management of privately owned woodlands.
